

ADDITION OF FATHER'S PARTICULARS

Being a **Great Dad** is adding your name to your child's Birth Certificate





Importance of FATHER'S NAME on the birth certificate

In all societies, a surname helps to identify an individual and their ancestral lineage. Hence, a father's name, occupation, place of birth and age on his child's birth certificate clearly states that he accepts paternity for his child.

If lines 9-12 are missing on a child's birth certificate, this may be an indication that paternity has not been accepted by the biological father.

Child Born to Unmarried Parents

Once a child is born to unmarried parents in a hospital, the father must be present at Bedside Registration.

If child is born outside of the hospital, the father must accompany the mother to the Local District Registrar (LDR) and sign the birth record at the time of registration or both parents sign the declaration of paternity within six (6) weeks of the birth, for the father's particulars to be added free of cost. Once six (6) weeks passes both parents are required to complete an Addition of Father's Particulars' (STATUS) form.

What is Required

- O Collect the STATUS form from the RGD or print form from our website at www.rgd.gov.jm
- Valid Government issued identification or notarized passport photograph
- O Father's Birth Certificate
- O Father's Deed Poll, if applicable

- O Statutory Declaration for status, where mother cannot be located
- Death certificate or burial order of mother, if applicable
- The mother and father must sign the joint declaration in the presence of a:

 - ▶ Lawyer

 - Commissioner of Oaths/Solicitor
- Return to the RGD with completed form and make payment or upload completed application and make payment online
